
SPINDLETOP

THE "GUSHER" THAT USHERED IN THE MODERN AGE OF PETROLEUM

ocated in the Southern portion of Beaumont, Texas on the Lamar University is the Spindletop-Gladys City Boomtown Museum dedicated to the history of the Spindletop oil gusher era. The museum features reconstructed buildings of Gladys City with the interiors furnished with real artifacts and antiques from the boomtown period. It also includes a wooden oil derrick which gushes water during special appointed times during the year to represent the original gusher.





It all started in 1892 when a group of men formed the Gladys City Oil, Gas and Manufacturing Company. Their purpose was to do exploratory drilling on top of a salt dome known as Spindletop located just a little south of Beaumont, Texas. The company drilled many dry holes and soon lost their investors.

One of the men, Pattillo Higgins left the company and joined forces with Captain Anthony F. Lucas. Lucas had previously been successful in drilling on salt domes. He and his men began drilling in 1899 and continued drilling till Christmas time



of 1900. All during that time, he and his crew faced one problem after another and the well soon became known as the "Lucas Folly". With an exhausted crew and the lack of funds, Lucas shut down drilling for the Christmas holidays while he pleaded with investors for more money.

Lucas was successful and with a well-rested and reenergized crew, drilling began again on New Year's Day of 1901. In the next ten days his crew drilled more feet than the entire year before.

On January
10, 1901 while
checking out some
of the drilling
equipment, mud
started bubbling up
through the hole. A
couple of seconds
later, pipe shot

out of the ground and then all grew silent. Lucas and his men waited, hoping for the gas and oil to come gushing out but nothing happened.


After some time the crew began cleaning up the mess when the ground shook beneath them, then a loud noise came from the hole and men scattered everywhere. Mud came shooting out of the well followed by gas and finally oil. The oil 'gusher" shot over the derrick, 150 feet into the air.



The Lucas well produced nearly 100,000 barrels a day and at its time was more oil ever seen in the entire world. The population of Beaumont tripled in size within a few months and during 1901, over 200 other wells were drilled on the Spindletop salt dome. The Spindletop gusher was responsible for creating several oil companies that would become major companies in the industry, including Gulf Oil, Amoco, Humble Oil Company which would later become EXXON, and Texaco which is now part of Chevron Corporation.

The use of oil drastically changed on that January day in 1901 from lamp fuel to fueling automobiles, trains and ships. The modern era of the petroleum age began, forever changing the face of industry and the world.

THE BEST KEPT SECRET IN EAST TEXAS

Then was the last time you enjoyed some great music at an old time Texas Opry? The Liberty Opry, in downtown Liberty, Texas serves up good times and great music for the entire family every Saturday.

Broadcaster George D. Hay coined the word "Opry" in 1928 to demonstrate the realism of folk and country music, and Saturday night Opry is a Texas tradition. No one does it better than the Liberty Opry. Walking through the doors of the old Park Theatre you feel the history envelope you along with the past and you feel the future as it is happening. The Park Theatre was originally built in 1938, by Ray Milentz, long-time resident of Liberty, and remained in his family until the mid 1980's. As a movie theatre, it served many generations with wholesome, family entertainment. Eventually it was sold to the Cox family in June of 1993, when it became "Liberty Opry on the Square", providing musical entertainment similar to Branson-style, only done best in Texas-style.

> > find on stage each week. The Liberty Opry Band is one of the most professional Opry bands you'll find in Texas. Most of the members played professionally on the traveling circuit with well know stars over the years to finally settle down in nearby areas to raise their families. You'll find: John Ray Baxter, Bass Guitar & Vocals; Rick Burton, Drums; Rodgers Cochran, Fiddle & Vocals; Calvin Gainey, Keyboards & Vocals; Andy Ligenfelter, Trumpet; Mike Loftin, Clarinet, Flute, Saxophone; Aaron Marshall, Steel Guitar; Ray Sowell, Guitar & Vocals: and then we have Jerry Locke, Emcee & Vocals; and Larry "Booger Lee" Etheridge, Comedian.

Jay and Nina Cantu purchased the business, now known as "Liberty Opry", in 2010. Building renovations along with new lights and sound equipment has brought excitement and new life into a solid family business of excellent weekly shows. They open each show welcoming all, some from great distances who enjoy the entertainment which could be country western, gospel, or good ol' rock 'n roll. Regardless of the genre be assured it will be a delightful powerhouse musical experience.

Before each show they find it important to acknowledge the veterans in the audience, followed by inviting all to join in with a prayer. Jay tells them, "If you'd prefer not to participate, that's your right, you may go to the snack bar and have a coffee, or soda pop on the house at this time."

At the Liberty Opry you become part of the family...the most important part. It is a wonderful family friendly place where the brightest stars of Texas are found, "Liberty Opry"! Make it a Saturday afternoon or evening of fun...come...enjoy!

Petite – Short dresses, dresses with empire




Busty - A halter or V-neck dress will enhance your bust. To downplay your bust, select a dress with more coverage on top and one that draws attention to your arms or legs.



SERRES WHO DERAY MAY MISS OUT

Some would-be move-up home sellers are eyeing home prices carefully. They're waiting to see how much home prices appreciate before they consider selling their home. But they may be missing their perfect opportunity, some housing experts say.

The best time to move may depend on when the home owner purchased their current residence, says Daren Blomquist, vice president of RealtyTrac. Blomquist says that home owners who purchased their home during the sluggish market the last two to three years may find moving up in 2013 may be their prime opportunity.

"Because they bought near the bottom, these home owners should have built up some good equity that can go toward the purchase of a new home, and waiting longer to build more equity likely won't provide much advantage given that other homes that they might want to move up to will also be appreciating at roughly the same pace," Home owners who wait much longer

to sell their home may miss out.

"If you're selling one house just to move up to another, it does you no good to wait for prices to rise — the price of the move-up home will increase faster than the price of the place you're leaving behind," says Redfin CEO Glenn Kelman.

Plus, mortgage rates are expected to come off the 3.5 percent range and reach 4.4 percent in the next year, according to the Mortgage Bankers Association. That will increase the costs of financing your next home.


House to House Redecorating







Cooking Up Viva Graditions

You Don't Have to Cater to Have a Gourmet Dinner

pring has sprung,
Azaleas are in bloom and our
calendars are filling fast with
festivals, proms, graduations and
confirmations. Nothing brings people
together like food. It's undeniable
that food and its preparation is
still trending, so why not seize this
opportunity to host and cater your
own culinary spread to mark one
of your upcoming Spring events?

Entertaining at home has almost become a lost art form. With a little planning, you can impress your friends, family and maybe even your in-laws by being the host with the most. If you're the nurturing type, or if your level of confidence has been elevated by a celebrity chef show, or if a caterer is not within

your budget, a little planning and a little cooking can result in a rewarding experience for you and your guests.

Time is your friend. It is crucial that you plan ahead. Begin with your menu and keep it simple. Depending on your culinary skill set, it may be best to use a familiar recipe, perhaps a family favorite. Consider the preparation time involved. Think of the many delicious recipes

that taste better the day after they're prepared. The more prep you can do a day or two ahead, the more time you will have to focus on garnishing the plates and setting your table.

We eat with our eyes first. Plating is extremely important. It is your canvas, your presentation. It's Spring time, and color is elementary to the season. Do not rely on table arrangements and linens for color.

Ironically nutritional experts tell us we should eat a rainbow of fruits and vegetables every day. Let us assume you serve a chicken casserole and fresh green beans. The casserole is flavorful and nutritional but it makes for a rather anemic presentation. The addition of red bell peppers sautéed into the beans or stuffed cherry tomatoes would provide balance and vibrancy to the plate. The color concept applies to every course. Salads are easiest because of the presence of greens. A dessert incorporating fresh fruits fills the bill easily. You may even consider adding strawberries and fresh melon chunks to iced tea with mint sprig garnish.

Buy a "back-up baguette". On more than one occasion I have burned the bread or dinner rolls just prior

to plating. Now I've told you too much about myself!

I sincerely hope this article inspires you to host a tea, luncheon or dinner party soon. Southeast Texas is beautiful in Spring and shall provide many opportunities to entertain. Your event can be as easy or a difficult as you make it. Keep it manageable, make it colorful and don't burn the bread. When you sit among your guests I know they will be well nourished, grateful and truly impressed.

1 stick butter 1 lg. diced onion 1 lg. diced green bell pepper



1 C. diced celery
1 lb. package crawfish
tails with juices
2 cans Campbells Golden

1 tsp. salt
½ tsp. black pepper

EASY TEXAS CHOCOLATE COOKIE SHEET CAKE

Ingredients:

1 Devils-food Chocolate Cake mix

3 tsp. cinnamon

2/3 C. milk

2 beaten eggs

2 Tbs. whiskey

2 Tbs. cooking oil

½ C. mini semi-sweet chocolate chips

Icing Ingredients:

1 stick butter

6 Tbs. milk

4 Tbs. dry cocoa

1 box sifted powdered sugar

1 tsp. vanilla

1 C. chopped pecans

Instructions:

Preheat oven for 375 degrees. Spray 11 x 16 baking pan with non-sticking backing spray. In a large mixing bowl, add cake mix and cinnamon. Blend well and set aside. In another mixing bowl, add milk, eggs, whiskey and cooking oil. Mix well and add to the dry ingredients bowl, stirring until well blended. Stir in mini chocolate chips. Pour into prepared baking pan. Tamp pan and place in oven for 20 mins. Stick a toothpick in middle. If toothpick comes out clean, remove cake. If toothpick comes out with cake mix stuck to it, continue baking cake for 5 more mins. When cake is baked, place on cooling rack.

Icing Instructions:

In a med. Sauce pan over med. Heat, melt butter, milk and cocoa, stirring constantly. Bring to a boil and boil for 1 full min., then remove from heat. Beat in powdered sugar until well blended, then beat in vanilla. Stir in nuts and spread over warm cake.

rowing up in Southeast Texas during the late 50's and early 60's was a time of enlightenment, discovery and great adventures for any teenager living in this rural area. It was a time of simple pleasures, hard work yet less stress; a slower pace with fewer demands; it was an age of innocents coming to an end; It was the age of listening

to your elders as they spoke of the "good old days", spinning yams and mixing history with tall tales...like "Rodeos and Roman Chariots".

The first time I saw a Roman chariot race was at the Pines Theatre in Silsbee, Texas in 1961 when the movie "Ben Hur" came to town. Like most kids, I was more enthralled with the scenes of the chariot races then I was with the rest of the movie. I loved horses and anything that had to do with horses got my full attention. I cried when the horses got 'hurt', booed the bad guy and

cheered Ben Hur to victory. With the exception of later drawing a life like Roman solider for my Father, I soon forgot all about the movie and chariot races, after all that was during the winter and spring brought new adventures.

Spring in Southeast Texas meant Rodeo season and the first week of May meant The Jasper Lion's Club Rodeo. (It still does but more about that later.) More horses as far as I was concerned, but to my parents, it was a little more than just that. My family had a small cattle ranch and rodeos were a time for trail rides, parades and socializing with other small ranchers in our area.

The next year, my family went to the Jasper Lion's Club Rodeo because Michael Landon, Little Joe from the TV hit show "Bonanza" was the entertainer along with something new that the promoters promised to be thrilling. As rodeos go this one was full of excitement and drama as one would expect. Finely, it was time for the intermission while they set up for the live entertainment.

Then the lights in the arena went dim and the announcer spoke over the broadcast system, "Ladies and Gentlemen, Boys and Girls, hold on to your seats and get ready for the thrill of a life time". Suddenly, two Roman Chariots rumbled across the arena floor. A Roman Chariot Race! The race was between two professional stunt men that were in the chariot races in the movie,

"Ben Hur" and the horses that they used were also from the movie. All the thrills, fears, excitement that I experienced the year earlier, I felt again, only this time it was real,

not Hollywood and it was up close. You could smell the horse sweat and feel the dust as it fell on your hair, clothes and skin. The crowd stood on its feet the whole time and was in unison with ohs and ahs. I stood there in the stands holding my breath until the race was over and a winner was announced. The cheering was so loud that it was deafening. That rodeo was one I would never forget.

Since then, I have attended many rodeos from all over


the state of Texas as well as Louisiana, but none can compare to the Jasper Lion's Club Rodeo of 1962. I have also seen the movie "Ben Hur" several times and even though I really get the meaning of the whole movie, I still like the Chariot Races the best.

The Jasper Lions Rodeo was founded in 1947 and is considered to be the oldest rodeo in this part of Texas. The rodeo is a PRCA rodeo consisting of four days of competition and attracting the top

cowboys and bull riders. It has also brought top entertainment to the area including Eddie Arnold to Kenny Chesney, and it is the largest fund raiser for Jasper, Texas.

This is a community affair with the help of local businesses and citizens, including trail rides, a downtown parade, and a Queens contest. The funds raised will be given back to the community to help the people in need. Jasper, Texas is referred to as "the Jewel of the Forest" and is located about 50 miles north of Silsbee,

Texas, on highway 96. This years' rodeo will be May 8 thru May 11, 2013 and the main entertainer will be Dustin Lynch. For more information on the Jasper Rodeo check out their web site jasperlionsrodeo.com


some of the most powerful antioxidants yet documented. These antioxidant flavanols enhance blood flow which provides an additional energy boost.
