We have done so since 1881 and pledge to continue.



# PORTS OF SOUTHEAST TEXAS... The Water Ways of Progress

In the early years after Texas proclaimed its independence from Mexico in 1836, a trickle of settlers and merchants were drawn to Southeast Texas primarily by maritime-related opportunities. The earliest official map of Jefferson County published in 1840 by surveyor O.H. Delano revealed a single oyster shell land trail connecting Beaumont with the settlement of Aurora on the west bank of Lake Sabine where Port Arthur is today. Movement by boat was quicker, safer and the avenue of choice.

Entrepreneurs from Orange had been among the first to recognize the value of an established shipping lane via Sabine Lake and Sabine Pass to the Gulf of Mexico. Savvy lumbermen saw the value of establishing their operations in Orange Harbor because it was more protected from the ravages of hurricanes than similar endeavors along the shores of Lake Sabine. The greatest obstacle for Orange sawmill operators was a shoal in the channel at Sabine Pass. Even light vessels drawing only four to five feet would run drag or hang up during low tide. To overcome this problem, they divided loads into smaller barges and reloaded larger ships anchored in deeper water of the gulf. This proved to be costly in lives and dollars.



Sabine Pass and the rivers that flowed through Sabine Lake were vital to transport timber, cotton, arms, cattle, shingles, tobacco, molasses, deer skins and many other commodities between Southeast Texas and world merchants.

By February 1861, the citizens of Beaumont and Orange organized a plan of defense for their lifeline to the gulf as the American Civil War threatened their navigation route. The Battle of Sabine Pass in 1863 routed a Union Navy blockade and scuttled Northern interference with the Sabine-Neches trade route.

In 1885, timber men from Beaumont, Orange and cities as far away as Tyler, Texas gathered to establish a harbor at Sabine Pass seeking mutual benefit for their men, equipment and cargo. They engineered a large steel harrow to rake out a deeper cut in the pass using their most powerful tugboats. Unfortunately, the result was not satisfactory.

The next step toward real success came when the timber men garnered support from congress to build jetties protecting the gulf entrance at Sabine Pass. Bundles of brush weighed down by stone were laid on either side of the main passage. They hoped the seaward flow from the Neches and Sabine Rivers would gradually

flush out a deeper channel. The government later sent a dredge to deepen the passage. In the mid 1890s, Arthur Stilwell established the Port Arthur Town-site on 4000 acres along the western edge of Lake Sabine. With the financial promotion of Dutch investment broker Jan deGoeijen, Stilwell completed a 24-foot deep shipping channel from Taylor Bayou to Sabine Pass in March 1899.

John "bet-a-million"
Gates was known for
bold business moves
and political savvy. After
stripping Arthur Stilwell
of his transportation

empire, Gates "gave" the Port Arthur Ship Channel to the government hoping to garner local support for Port Arthur's exclusive use of it. Port Arthur sought to block Orange and Beaumont whom were seeking to develop their own deep water channels and ports.

The Port Arthur Channel and Dock Company came under fire for fouling Lake Sabine with mud from their 7 mile dredging campaign for which they had not sought approval or permit from the Galveston Corps of Engineer office. The issue was put to rest when the company agreed to pump future dredging material into settling containment areas. This was the beginning of the modern revetment development program that continues today.

A summit was called to discuss the impasse between the three communities. A who's who of influential leaders gathered from Beaumont, Orange and Port Arthur at Pleasure Pier on Sabine Lake. Orange and Beaumont pledged to help Port Arthur become a full U.S. Port of Entry if all three cities would have access to the improved waterway.

In 1901, Congress appropriated \$325,000 to dredge the ship channel to 10.5 feet and the legislature authorized local authority to issue bonds for waterway development. This eventually resulted in creation of locally managed navigation districts. Jefferson and Orange Counties were then enabled to levy navigation taxes with voter approval and funds could be matched by federal dollars.

Dr. E.W. Brown, H.J. Lutcher, J.W. Link, and W.H. Stark are among those who traveled to Washington to present the concept to Congress and the U.S. Corps of Engineers. Appropriations for the improvements benefitting all three cities were finally approved in 1911.





With government assistance, salt-water locks were completed in 1916 and a 25-foot deep channel was dredged from Port Arthur to Beaumont.

Entrepreneurs E.W. Brown and W.H. Stark deeded land to the City of Orange creating the first public Port of Orange. Warehouses and wharves with modern loading equipment was built with public funding as well as a 3,000 foot slip dredged to a depth of 26 feet. Conveniently, just above the public port were the Lutcher and Moore Lumber Company and other private docks.

With discovery of oil near Beaumont in 1901, petroleum products quickly eclipsed timber as the primary tonnage of maritime cargoes.

In 1912, the Port Arthur Canal was incorporated into the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1875. By 1935, the Sabine Neches Waterway was deepened to 34 feet to Beaumont. The section is currently maintained at a depth of 40 feet with a 34-foot turning basin. The National Defense Reserve Fleet maintains an auxiliary group of vessels in a restricted basin seven miles below Beaumont at McFaddin Bend Cut-off.

The Sabine channel to Orange is currently 30 feet deep with a 25 foot channel around Orange Harbor Island. This project was completed in 1980. The Sabine Channel and jettied entrance to the gulf is currently maintained at a depth of 42 feet.

Studies regarding the future deepening of the local shipping channel to 50 feet from the gulf to Port of Beaumont began in 1997. Funding issues and environmental concerns have slowed progress until



recently with bi-partisan passage of the US Senate Water Resource Development Act. It now awaits approval by the house and president. Those supporting the improvements point to increased competition heralded by the anticipated opening of an improved Panama Canal in 2015 with a depth of 60 feet and a world fleet that is growing in carrying capacity. Others have expressed concerned about the effects on the environment caused by a significantly deeper canal and the powerfully erosive force caused by water rushing to fill behind the area displaced by each passing ship.


The U.S. Northeast currently has only three ports with waterways deep enough to handle fully loaded "Panamax" ships which are estimated to contain as much as half of the world fleet's carrying capacity. Although the Southeast is forecast to experience the nation's heaviest growth in population and trade, no port from Virginia to Florida or across the Gulf of Mexico to Texas have shipping channels with 50-feet draft capacity. As a central energy gateway with


the nation's most modern refinery and pipeline capacity, the ports and waterways of Southeast Texas see a need for deeper waters.

State of the art rail and trucking compliment the package of infrastructure generated by Port of Beaumont, Port of Orange and Port of Port Arthur. Approximately 75,000 local ship movements occur each year made possible by the dock, storage, loading and transportation connection services provided by local docks. Although competitive in some aspects, each local port offers a unique set of services, storage, support and loading services that cater to the unique needs of their local maritime industries. Growth related to local port and maritime industries is predicted to create up to 20,000 jobs and billions of additional revenue in coming years.


# EAST OF THE SABINE BUES

hen you cross over the Sabine
River heading east on I-10, you
enter into another World; welcome
to the land of the Cajuns. At first look,
you might find many similarities between
Southwest Louisiana and Southeast Texas;
many of the names sound the same and
we like some of the same foods; even
some of the landscape looks the same;
but that is where the similarities end.

Cajun history is older than Texas history.
Southern Louisiana was first settled in the early 17th century as a French colony in order to establish a French nation from the Gulf of Mexico up to Canada, where they already had holdings. Their domain of Louisiana ended after they lost to the British in the Seven Year's War. Great Britain took the French lands of Canada and Spain took possession of Louisiana with the exception of New Orleans, which remained in the hands of the French.

Spanish-speaking immigrants from the Canary Islands settled around Lake Charles about the same time the French-speaking Acadians in Canada were expelled by Britain and took refuge in South Louisiana in the area now called Acadia Parish. They were all welcomed by the Spanish, increasing the Catholic population. These descendants came to be called Cajuns.



#### Lake Charles/Southwest Louisiana

Have fun exploring Southwest Louisiana from the many diverse activities and events they have to offer. If you like exciting Casino gaming, Lake Charles is your town, with Casino gaming and Las Vegas like shows. Start your adventure at Delta Downs Racetrack in Vinton, Louisiana. Be sure to visit the Baton Rouge Zoo and connect with animals or take a train ride on the Cypress Bayou Railroad.

There is plenty of shopping, dining, music and dancing to be found. If you like gaming, try your luck at the Belle of Baton Rouge Casino & Hotel, Hollywood Casino, or the new L'Auberge Casino & Hotel Baton Rouge.



### **2013 LAMAR FOOTBALL OUTLOOK**

ith its first crop of four-year seniors taking the field this season, optimism is running high around the Lamar football program. Lamar will have 17 players suit up this season that have earned three letters since the university reinstated football.

Not only will the Cardinals be a much older team than in years past, but they will enjoy the return of eight offensive starters, seven defensive starters and 48 total letterwinners. With a coaching staff that is primarily the same as last season

under head coach Ray Woodard, Lamar is looking to move to the upper echelon of the Southland Conference standings in 2013.

Offensive coordinator Larry Kueck is in the enviable position of having two quarterbacks who have spent significant time on the field heading into this season. Redshirt junior Caleb Berry comes out of spring practices slightly ahead of senior Ryan Mossakowski, but both could see time on the field this year.

Lamar's top three pass catchers from a year ago are also back but a new crop of running backs will be looked upon to carry the load this season as Lamar's top three rushers from a year ago are gone. As for the offensive line, three starters will return.

His front three accounted for a third of Lamar's quarterback sacks last year. The linebacking corps is deep and talented this year, and the secondary is nearly as experienced with four seniors currently manning the starting positions.

Three-year starter Kollin Kahler returns for his final campaign at punter with the school's best career average already on his resume. In addition to his strong play on the field, Kahler was a CoSID Academic All-District 7 Selection in 2012.


"Since the beginning of time, man has hunted. I know the doctor said no more red meat, but venison is better than beef





# HOME SALES SOAR, CONSUMER CONFIDENCE RETURNS

he more than 100 major real estate brokers who attended RISMedia's Mid-Year Power Broker Forum earlier this month virtually all reported first quarter gains in transactions and dollar volume from 2012. Consumer confidence combined with near historic low mortgage interest rates is fueling the residential real estate industry's resurgence, and industry leaders are reporting that many leading REALTORS® from around the country are experiencing a tremendous uptick in consumer

interest and transactions that they haven't seen in more than five years.

"Home values and consumer confidence are

directly related," said Lawrence Yun, NAR chief economist. 

That's up from 600 last year. The contest challenges students to reflect on core values or the ideals by which they strive to live their lives. Among those examining their own lives for the presence of qualities like perseverance, forgiveness, compassion, love, and bravery, to name a few, is Elizabeth C. from Vincent Middle School.

Upon the death of her mother, Elizabeth wrote that she felt like "giving up on life," when she was just a fifth grader. Then she realized that when something "is taken away from you, you must find perseverance and strength. Giving up is not an option."

Grab a tissue before you dive into Abigail L.'s essay. After being sexually abused the Vidor Junior High student wrote about forgiveness, "Yeah, I would not be able to talk to either of them face to face, but they are forgiven in my heart. That's my Law of Life. Forgiveness is freedom."

Bassam Syed, this year's first-place winner from Marshall Middle School, would like to see the golden rule applied more often in his school. "Every day I observe some type of disrespect," he wrote. "Talking to one man working at a cash register should be no different in tone and in politeness, than talking to a teacher or friend."

Avery Jagoe, a seventh grader from Vincent Middle School wrote about compassion. Looking to his mother's special education students for inspiration, Jagoe wrote, "They can't do anything on their own – not eat, use the bathroom, brush their teeth, or even put on their shoes.



These are people like you and me, and they deserve to do what they want. If I could, I would switch lives with them for a day. I would, so they could see how it feels to be like us."





As for the future, the BBB continues to strive to advance marketplace trust along with helping develop the next generation of educated and ethical consumers and business leaders through T.O.G.G.L.E. (Teaching Our Generations Great Leadership Ethics) which is made up of two programs: Laws of Life and In Pursuit of Ethics.



He served 6 years on the Silsbee City Council as Mayor pro-tem and was elected as Mayor in 1982.

Herbert Muckleroy continues to be the Mayor of Silsbee today. In 1998, he was named Citizen of the Year by the Silsbee Chamber of Commerce.

#### Lake Charles, LA. Mayor Randy Roach

Randy Roach was born in Lake Charles, Louisiana and graduated from LaGrange High School. He earned his undergraduate degree in accounting from LSU and his law degree from LSU.

He is married to Nancy Seger Roach and has two children and four grandchildren. From 1985-1987, Roach served as the Assistant City Attorney for the City of Lake Charles, and represented the City in all phases of the Chennault Consolidation project. He drafted and presented

federal and state legislation and conducted negotiations with Boeing Aircraft, formerly located at Chennault. He then served two terms (1988-1996) as a State Representative in the Louisiana Legislature, representing District 36, which included part of Calcasieu and Cameron parishes.

As mayor, he has worked closely with city and parish governments and other agencies to form partnerships and pool resources that benefit not only Lake Charles, but also the entire Southwest Louisiana five-parish area.



#### Port Arthur, TX Mayor Deloris "Bobbie" Prince

Mayor Prince is a single mother of 3 children and the proud grandmother of 3 grandchildren. She is a graduate of Lincoln

High School of Port Arthur, and attended Lamar University. She also holds several certificates in Cultural Diversity training. She is retired from DuPont and DuPont Dow Elastomers after 36 ½ years.

Before being elected as Mayor, Prince worked with several community programs. She served on Port Arthur City Council for three years prior to becoming Mayor and initiated "One Block at a Time" program for the city of Port Arthur. Prince was elected Mayor in 2007 and continues to serve today.

Mayor Prince was the recipient of the "Pioneering Woman" Award of 2008, the "2005 Ambassador of the Year Award" from the Greater Port Arthur Chamber of Commerce, and was the Port Arthur News 2008 Unsung Hero. She serves on the Julie Rogers "Gift of Life" executive Board and as a Representative of the Texas Municipal League Board of Directors Region 16.

#### **GRILLED SHRIMP & SAUSAGE KABOBS**

#### **Ingredients:**

1/2 cup chili sauce
1 tablespoon honey
1/4 teaspoon
garlic powder



1/2 lb. smoked sausage cut into 12 pieces
1/2 lb. shelled deveined uncooked large shrimp
1 medium green bell pepper, cut into 12 pieces

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. First heat gas or charcoal grill.
- In small bowl, combine chili sauce, honey and garlic powder; mix well.
- 3. Alternately thread sausage, shrimp and bell pepper onto four 12 to 14-inch metal skewers.

- Brush kabobs with some of chili sauce mixture; reserve remaining sauce mixture.
- 4. When grill is heated, place kabobs on gas grill over medium heat or on charcoal grill 4 to 6 inches from medium coals. Cook 8 to 10 minutes or until shrimp turns pink, turning kabobs and brushing frequently with reserved sauce mixture.
- 5. Bring any remaining chili sauce mixture to a boil. Serve warm mixture with kabobs.(Tip) When you make kabobs, be sure that the pieces on the skewers are of uniform size so that they cook evenly.

5 cups seasoned bread crumbs


Oil for deep frying

#### **Instructions:**

- Add rice to salted water and bring to boil. Simmer until rice is mushy. Remove from heat, add butter and cinnamon. Cool.
- Fry meat in 1/4 cup oil until meat loses redness. Add onions, celery, garlic and cook slowly for 10 minutes. Add chili powder, tomato sauce and water. Simmer 1 hour, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat, add parsley, cheese, and salt and pepper to taste. Set aside to cool.
- 3. To form rice ball, put 1/3 to 1/2 cup of rice in hand greased with meat grease. Form a cup in the palm of the hand like a bird-nest. Add one tablespoon of meat mixture and roll into a firm

ball. Continue to make rice balls.

4. Chill and dip rice ball in beaten egg and roll in seasoned breadcrumbs. Fry in hot deep oil until golden brown. Makes three dozen.







rowing up in Southeast Texas during the late 50's and early 60's was a time of enlightenment, discovery and great adventures for any teenager living in this rural area. It was a time of simple pleasures, hard work yet less stress; a slower pace with fewer demands; it was an age of innocents coming to an end; It was the age of listening to your elders as they spoke of the "good old days", spinning yarns and mixing history with tall tales...like "A Snowball in July".

The first time my Papaw took me to the movies was to see an animated film at the Pines

Theatre in Silsbee Texas, back when it only cost a dime for a five year old to get in and a quarter for an adult. We arrived a little early, but my Papaw knew the owners, so they sold us our tickets and let us wait in the lobby.

The lobby was filled with the smell of fresh popcorn. I watched with fascination, as the lady behind the concession counter popped another batch. I then looked at all the candies, trying to make up my mind which one to choose, when a man dressed in rubber boots, a long leather apron and big rubber gloves came through the lobby door. He was pulling a little wooden wagon with the biggest ice cube I had ever seen. All the ice I had ever seen before came from our ice box in the aluminum trays that would make little ice cubes; but this ice cube was a giant!

The man went behind the counter and using big black tongs; he stabbed the giant ice cube and lifted it up into a coke box. Noticing my wide eyed expression, he chipped off a small piece of ice and handed it to me. I was thrilled! Of course my Papaw knew the man and made arrangements


for us to drop by the Ice House later
that day so I could see how ice was made.
It was now time to get our goodies and go sit down for the movie.


I ate my candy, drank my coke, watched the cartoons and ate half of my Papaws' popcorn, but I kept squirming in my seat asking him when we would go to the Ice House. Papaw finally gave up on the movie, and we went straight to the Ice House.

The tall man at the Ice House bent down so that his face was even with mine. "Young lady, have you ever seen it snow in July?" I responded with a long no. He led us to the back of the building where he placed a big block of ice into a large machine that looked something like a meat grinder. He turned on the machine, it made such a loud terrible noise, I had to cover my ears. Soon little tiny flakes came out of the big grinder and floated up toward the ceiling. I clapped my hands with delight as they softly floated

I started to cry, I was having so much fun and I didn't want to leave. The more Papaw insisted we leave, the more I cried. Then the tall man asked me if I would like to take a snowball home. but I would have to go straight home and put it in the freezer section of my ice box or the snowball would melt. I stopped crying immediately; he scooped up some of the "snow" ice, formed a ball, and placed it into a paper coffee cup. I gently held my precious snowball and told Papaw to hurry home.

The old Ice House still exists today. The Silsbee Ice House Museum and Cultural Center is located at 818 Ernest Ave. just off highway 96 in Silsbee. In its hay-day in the 1940's and 1950's, the Ice House produced about 30,000 tons of ice a week. It was later sold to Sparkle Ice Company. It was closed down in 1983 and then received historical designation from the Texas Historical Commission in 1991. In addition to housing artifacts of the old Ice House, the Museum has a historical display of the Santa Fe Railway Company, the Kirby timber industry, and a fine art gallery.



Some things about Labor Day have not changed since its inception in 1882. And then, some things have changed drastically. "I was always celebrating the last weekend before my kids went back to school, but school starts earlier now," said Mason.

Mason's grandson, Jerrod LeBoef, 15, of Beaumont, said he will mourn the end of summer holiday, even though his first day of school, like many other Southeast Texas students, falls a week before the first Monday in September.

Whether celebrating or mourning, both generations can come together for the traditional melon, links and cool drinks in Pinehurst. "These old people like me get out there and dance and visit with people they haven't seen in years or since the last picnic. It won't cost guests or taxpayers one nickel," said Pinehurst City Administrator Joe Parkhurst.

That's one day off for the working man or woman and a free lunch to boot. But Labor Day is about more than watermelon and white shoes. Maribeth Jones, 59, of Beaumont, remembers that the fruit of her late mother's labor never landed far from the family dinner table. Referring to her mother as a domestic engineer in an era when classified ads mostly read, "Help Wanted Male."

"The Labor Day holiday is ... an American tradition and definitely one here at Pipefitters Local Union 195," said James C. Williamson, business manager at United Association Local Union 195 in Nederland. "The American worker, when called upon, always gets the job done."

It is a get-her-done attitude that prevails at Pinehurst's annual picnic for seniors too. A volunteer committee serves around 800 seniors and their guests so that they can save their feet for the dance floor.
