

THEFROM AND CRAWFISH

he Timber industry had been a very important resource to the early growth of Southeast Texas. The woodlands of this region continue to play an important role today, both economically and environmentally.


The most dense forest lands of Texas

lie in the Big Thicket region, just north of **Beaumont. The Big Thicket was mostly** uninhabited until heavy settlement from the U.S. began in the mid-19th century. It was often used as a refuge by outlaws and runaway slaves. This forest was home to a variety of hardwoods, an abundance of tall pine trees, to native Indians and to the **American Black Bear.**

One of the first steam operated sawmills in Texas was planned in 1829 in what is now modern

Houston. After the Texas Revolution in 1836, lumber production increased steadily that by 1860 there were over 200 saw mills in the state and mostly in this region. The construction of railroads throughout the eastern and southeastern part of the state led to a boom in lumber production starting in the 1880s. The following 50-year period in which the Texas timber industry flourished came to be known as the "bonanza era" and Southeast Texas led the way.

By the start of the 20th century timber was one of the leading economic engines. Lumber barons, such as John Henry Kirby, were among the wealthiest people in the state. By 1907 Texas was the third largest lumber producer in the United States. The clearing of fields for oil exploration and the related demand for lumber through the first half of the 20th century destroyed much of the remaining forest lands in the state.




oseph Broussard, pioneer rice grower and miller, was born in 1866, in the home of his maternal grandparents on Hillebrandt Bayou in the site that is now Beaumont, Texas. Broussard was reared on the family ranch near the site of present Hamshire. Texas where he worked cattle and delivered mail on horseback in the lower Taylor's Bayou area of Jefferson County.

When a post office was established in 1885, he became its first postmaster and named it La Belle for his fiancée, Mary Belle Bordages. They were married in 1889 and moved to Beaumont, where Broussard bought one-third interest in a gristmill. In 1892 he converted the gristmill to a rice mill and founded Beaumont Rice Mills.

HISTORY

It became the first commercially successful rice mill in Texas. The mill continued in operation till the late 1980s under the founder's grandson.

From 1907 to 1918 Broussard was president of the Rice Millers'

and Dealers' Association, the forerunner of the present Rice Millers' Association of America. In 1909, when the industry faced a financial crisis, Broussard was a member of a two-man team that successfully marketed American rice in Europe.

Less than 1,500 acres was planted with rice in Texas in 1892. To help increase rice production, in 1898 Broussard co-founded the Beaumont Irrigation Company, whose initial canal led to the formation of the Lower Neches Valley Authority. The system is now capable of irrigating 50,000 acres of rice while supplying the area's industrial requirements for water. At the time of Broussard's death, acres planted with rice in Texas annually reached well over 400,000, and production had spread to twenty-three counties.


Rice production has steadily increased in Southeast Texas over the last thirty years. One of the largest millers of rice in our area today is Doguet's Rice Milling Company. The company was established in 1979.


here there are rice fields, there are crawfish. This freshwater crustacean resembles a small lobster, to which they are related, and are often referred to as crawdads or mudbugs. They breathe through feather-like gills and are found in bodies of water that do not freeze to the bottom. They are mostly found in brooks and streams where there is fresh running water and have shelter against predators. Most crawfish cannot tolerate polluted water.

Since the rice farmers use freshwater to irrigate their rice fields, these man-made ponds have become the perfect breeding grounds for the two local species of crawfish in this area, Procambarus clarkii (red swamp crawfish) and Procambarus zonangulus (white river crawfish). Both species are native to the Gulf coast region and have adapted to coping with the wet-dry climate cycles found throughout this area.

Crawfish have often been used for bait as well as for a source of food, but it wasn't until the 1960s that crawfish became a popular cash crop. Today, South Louisiana and Southeast Texas produce over 95% of the crawfish produced for eating in the U. S.

he 2014 South Texas State Fair is the 71st such event sponsored by the Young Men's Business League (YMBL), but the story of the Fair in Beaumont goes back many years before this. The Fair actually is more than 100 years old. The first event was called simply the Beaumont Fair. Families came with picnic lunches and some even camped overnight on the grounds. Later the fair became known as the Southeast Texas State Fair, but in 1921 the "east" was dropped and the present name adopted.


A Fair Association was formed to promote the exposition and did quite well through 1941 until the bombing of Pearl Harbor in December brought the United States into World War II. Fairs all across the nation ceased to function because of the war, but at an invitation from the city and the military (due to soldiers being stationed near Beaumont, and in need of entertainment and diversion from army life), the YMBL assumed operation of the Fair in 1942.

During the war, the Fair was known at first as the "YMBL Victory Fair" and was primarily an agricultural exposition and livestock show featuring a carnival midway. The Fair was strictly a volunteer effort with YMBL members selling tickets, manning the gates, parking cars and providing expertise in the agriculture and livestock shows. Thousands of soldiers came from Camp Polk in Louisiana and Fort Hood in Killeen to spend a weekend in Beaumont and to attend the Fair.

The South Texas State Fair drew more than 250,000 in 1957, and since that time estimated attendance has grown to more than half a million drawn from ten counties in South East Texas and three South West Louisiana parishes. Although a "nonprofit" committee of the YMBL, the Fair supports the sponsoring organization with more than 90% of its total revenue which the YMBL shares with the community in direct gifts to local and area charitable organizations, youth projects, civic programs and other efforts to aid the elderly and those in need.

The South Texas State Fair runs from March 27 through April 6. The YMBL/PRCA Rodeo will be held March 27 & 28 at the Ford Park Arena. More scheduling details are available at www.ymbl.org

BIRDING AT TYRRELL PARK AND BOATING ON A NECHES RIVER ADVENTURE!

pring is the best time of year to discover new things! Some people like flowers or baby animals, while others are into birding. Birding has become one of the top favorite past times World Wide. This global past time is a hobby for many and serious business for some. Birding doesn't cost a lot of money, nor does it require a lot of equipment. All you need are a good pair of hiking boots, binoculars, paper and pencil, and a map. Of course, if you are new to birding you might want to go with a group led by a guide. The Golden Triangle Audubon Club has scheduled birding excursions all year long or you can talk to the Bird Man at Tyrrell Park. He would love to show you around Cattail Marsh and tell you all about the many birds you can discover in the area.


Cattail Marsh includes 900-acres of wetlands along the banks of Hildebrandt Bayou and Willow Marsh Bayou. It is a wildlife refuge for a variety of aquatic mammals and more than 350 species of birds annually, including: pelicans, egrets, roseate spoonbills, ducks, ibis, doves and red-winged blackbirds. Originally constructed in 1993 by the Beaumont Public Utilities Department as the final phase of Beaumont's wastewater treatment system, this natural and innovative process of cleaning wastewater has attracted the interest of environmentalists from across the state. Tyrrell Park and Cattail Marsh both offer a variety of recreational activities with more than eight miles of gravel levee roads for jogging, hiking, biking, horseback riding, bird watching, wildlife photography and picnicking. Cattail Marsh is part of the Big Thicket National Preserve and also part of the Great Texas Coastal Birding Trail in the section known as the Upper Coastal Trail. This year marks the 50th Anniversary of the Big Thicket






National Preserve which was established in 1974 with the intent of preserving the unique woodlands of the Big Thicket. Your first stop at Big Thicket National Preserve should be the visitor center located 7 miles north of Kountze, Texas, on U.S. Highway 69. Here, staff will assist you with orientation to the many units of the Preserve and the surrounding region. The facility is located seven miles north of Kountze, Texas, on U.S. Highway 69 at the junction of FM 420. and is open daily from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The visitor center provides many opportunities to discover the rich diversity of resources found in the Preserve.

The Big Thicket Association was formed to help develop public awareness of both the Big Thicket National Preserve and the Neches River. In addition to speaking to various groups and organizations, they raise money through the Neches River Adventures boat rides.



Enjoy a leisurely trip on the Neches River. This ecologically diverse river has been called "The Last Wild River" in east Texas. The Neches is home to more than 200 tree species, 47 mammals, 300 birds and many reptiles and amphibians, including alligators.







Former coach has been involved with Lamar since 1969 By Clay Trainum



NEW BRAUNFELS - Ron Wesbrooks' Lamar coaching career may have ended in 1987, but his legacy has stood the test of time. He has now been inducted into the Texas Tennis Coaches Hall of Fame.

Wesbrooks, who first set foot on campus as a graduate student in 1969, took over the head coaching role for the university Tennis Team in the fall of 1970 and led the Cardinals to their second Southland Conference title in 1973. He'd go on to record 198 career victories over

16 years, both marks ranking the most in Lamar school history.

"I came here as a graduate student, and I was fortunate enough to stick around," Wesbrooks said. "Lewis Hilley really put Lamar men's tennis on the map with the national titles in the NAIA, and I happened to be in the right place at the right time as we moved into Division I. It was a good team when I got here, and I still remember the 1973 team, which had several international players but also three players from Beaumont. It was a really special group."

Wesbrooks is the first Lamar coach to be inducted into the Texas Tennis Coaches Hall of Fame, and he joins Cathy Beene as the second person with LU ties to be inducted into a hall of fame this year. A plaque bearing Wesbrooks' name will be on permanent display at Newcombe's Tennis Ranch in New Braunfels as well as at the Texas Sports Hall of Fame in Waco.

"It's really a nice honor, and since I've been out of coaching for so long, I was kind of surprised to get the phone call," Wesbrooks said. "The TTCA is made up of a variety of coaches from both the high

school and college levels, and they are very active in trying to educate and promote the value of tennis. It's a beautiful game that can teach you a lot about life, and this organization shares that belief."

Since stepping down as LU's coach in 1987, Wesbrooks has continued to teach at the university, introducing more than 5,000 students to the game over his tenure. He's also remained very involved with the Beaumont Labor Day Tennis **Tournament since 1973 and helped start the Southeast Texas** Tennis Association Zone Advancement Tournament, both of which are sanctioned by the United States Tennis Association.

Wesbrooks has remained one of LU's biggest tennis fan, and he's a regular at Thompson Family Tennis Center on campus. Earlier this past fall, the name of the annual Lamar men's tennis tournament was changed to the Ron Wesbrooks Invitational in his honor.

What is so phenomenal about Simon's story was the fact that he was the father of eight children, almost penniless, and had never fished before. He didn't own a boat either. He used the grocery money to enter the tournament. He caught his winning, 9 pound bass from the boat launch.

Brandon Adams was the lucky grand prize winner in 2008. Brandon was twelve years old and wanted to fish with his Dad and Granddad in the Adult division instead of the LiL Anglers





Walter Umphrey-#84 Thomas Jefferson HS

t the heart of every successful team is a tenacious leader with a competitive drive to win and an unwavering commitment to the pursuit of excellence. "Walter as the lawyer was one that took place rather quickly. Walter came home one day and said, "I keep making money for all these lawyers. I think I want to be a lawyer. What do you think?" Since we didn't have any children, I said let's go!", Sheila relates. It is said that behind every successful man is a good woman, and truer words were never spoken about Sheila Umphrey. "We packed our things, threw them in a car I had borrowed from my brother and off we went." She said, "he studied law at Baylor and I worked in a bank making \$250 a month. That was probably 1963. It was an adventure and an investment that has paid large dividends for

countless people, for numerous causes over the last 40 plus years."

Walter earned his Juris Doctorate degree in 1965. He returned to Southeast Texas, where he began work as a prosecuting attorney in the Jefferson County District Attorney's Office and earned the position of Chief Felony Prosecutor.

In 1969. Walter decided to move to the other side of the courtroom as a plaintiff attorney. He with his partner, the late David Provost, started their firm in Port Arthur with two additional lawyers and

a staff of five. To say the Provost-Umphrey Law Firm has experienced near incredulous growth is not an exaggeration.


They have offices in Beaumont, Port Arthur, Houston and Austin, as well as in Washington D.C. and Nashville, Tennessee, with 54 lawyers and a support staff of 225. What is even more astonishing is Walter Umphrey has never sent a bill to a single client! "A poor person ought to be able to hire a good lawyer. My clientele can't afford to give money. They're working people, middle-class or poor." states Umphrey. "If a case is not worth taking on a contingent basis, then it's not worth taking!" Walter is listed in "The Best Lawyers in America" and was recently selected as one of the top 100 lawyers of the 20th century. He is included in the "Legal Legends: A Century of Texas Law and Lawyering" and was selected by fellow Texas attorneys as a Texas Super Lawyer, an honor held by only the top 5 percent of the Texas Bar.

Walter Umphrey, who first came to prominence in the 1970's as a pioneer in the asbestos litigation, is undoubtedly best known as the lead attorney for the "Dream Team", a consortium of 5 Texas law firms that represented the State of Texas in the tobacco litigation, which led to a 17.3 billion-dollar recovery at a time when the tobacco industry had never paid anyone. "I knew it was going to be a tough long fight and was going to take three or four years of my career, and it did," said Umphrey. "They had never paid anybody and my theory was that if history was going to be made, I wanted to be a part of it." In addition to investing the time to make history

and benefit the State of Texas, he and four other firms put up about \$9 million dollars each when they signed on to take on Phillip Morris.

In addition to the time he spends in the defense of people and causes, Walter makes time to support civic and community causes. He served as Director of the National Wildlife Association, Director of the Ladybird Johnson Wildflower Center and Past Director

of Texas Regional Bancshares, Inc., Texas State Bank and as Vice-Chairman of the Texas State Parks and Wildlife Commission (1991-1997). Walter donated land on Pleasure Island in Port Arthur for a state park. The newest cancer center in Southeast Texas was named the Walter Umphrey Cancer Center, and he and Sheila donated \$10 million dollars to Baylor Law School. The Umphrey's have been major supporters of Lamar University and its' athletic department. Walter and Sheila Umphrey are the proud parents of Bart



Umphrey and Paige Umphrey Logsdon, both of Beaumont, and the loving grandparents to seven grandchildren. As part of their extended family, Walter counts Abby, Callie and Katy, his Labrador retrievers, whom he dearly loves.

Walter Umphrey is still an active vital part of the Provost-Umphrey Law Firm. "I pick two or three cases a year and beat my chest so I don't get too rusty," he says. "I never will retire. I enjoy coming down here and seeing what I put together perpetuate itself."



APPLES AND BERRIES SHINE FOR CARDIOVASCULAR HEALTH

he disease-busting credentials of apples and berries just received a nice boost thanks to some nifty new science. In the apple study – investigators found that healthy adults who consumed a single large apple a day for four weeks lowered their levels of "oxidized LDL" (the toxic form of bad cholesterol that initiates artery-clogging) by 40 percent, relative to a control group who did not consume an apple each day. Apples are uniquely high in a class of powerful antioxidants called flavanoids thought to be the "active ingredient" behind the study findings. (1)

In another study, investigators measured the level of intake of anthocyanins in over 1,800 women and compared their anthocyanin consumption to their blood pressure and the stiffness of their arteries. Anthocyanins are special plant compounds known for their robust antioxidant and anti-

inflammatory prowess, and berries provide more than any other food. Women consuming the most anthocyanins, equivalent to 1-2 portions of berries daily, had significantly lower systolic blood pressure and less stiff arteries. The magnitude of the beneficial effect in the women consuming the most anthocyanins vs. those consuming the least was on par with countering 10 years of artery aging! (2)

Although I strive to include a broad variety of brightly colored fruits in my diet regularly – the two I include most frequently are berries and apples. www.DrAnnWellness.com

SOUTHEAST TEXAS SEAFOOD STEW

Ingredients:

- 1 ½ lb. unpeeled, medium-size raw shrimp
- 2 celery ribs with ends
- 1 large yellow onion with skin still on
- 2 qt. reduced-sodium fat-free chicken broth
- 12 oz. smoked sausage cut in ½ inch coins
- 1 green bell pepper, chopped
- 1 Tbsp. cooking oil
- 3 garlic cloves, chopped
- 1 lb. small red potatoes, halved
- 1 (12 oz.) bottle beer
- 1 Tbsp. fresh thyme leaves, chopped
- 2 bay leaves
- 2 tsp. Creole seasoning
- 1/4 tsp. red pepper flakes
- 1 ½ lb. cubed fresh catfish fillets
- 1 lb. pre-boiled whole crayfish
- Salt & black pepper to taste

Instructions:

- 1. Peel shrimp, place shells in a large saucepan. (Refrigerate peeled shrimp until ready to use.) Chop off the celery ends and peel the onion, place the ends and peeling in saucepot. Add broth; bring to a boil over medium-high heat. Reduce heat to low and simmer 30 minutes. Chop the rest of the celery and onion and set aside.
- 2. Meanwhile, cook sausage in a large Dutch oven over medium-high heat, stirring often for 7 to 8 minutes or until browned. Remove sausage; pat dry. Wipe Dutch oven clean. Heat cooking oil in Dutch oven and saute' chopped celery, onion and bell pepper for 5 to 7 minutes. Add garlic, and saute' for additional 1 minute. Stir in potatoes, next 5 ingredients, and sausage.
- 3. Pour broth mixture through a fine wire-mesh strainer into Dutch oven and discard solids. Increase heat to high; bring to a boil. Reduce heat to low, cook, stirring occasionally for 20 minutes or until the potatoes are tender.
- 4. Add fish; cook 2 to 3 minutes or until just opaque. Add shrimp, and cook 2 to 3 minutes or till shrimp curl and turn pink. Add crayfish and cook for an additional 2 to 3 minutes. Discard bay leaves. Add salt and black pepper to taste.
- 5. Spoon seafood into warmed soup bowls; add enough broth to cover and serve with French bread or hushpuppies

CRAYFISH PIE

Ingredients:

Double-crust pie dough,
4 ounces (1 stick) butter
1/2 cup flour
1 cup diced onions
1/2 cup diced green pepper
1/2 cup diced celery
1 pound peeled crawfish tails
1/4 cup chopped green onion
2 tablespoons chopped parsley
2 tablespoons Creole spice



Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

- 1. Roll out half of pie dough and fit into a 9-inch pie plate; chill.
- 2. In a skillet melt butter, add flour and whisk into a paste.

 Cook roux for 5 minutes or until it begins to turn lightly golden.
- 3. Add onions, pepper and celery.
 Cook, stirring, 4 minutes, until vegetables are tender.
- 4. Add crawfish, green onions, parsley and seasoning.

 Cook just until heated through, about 1 minute more. Let cool slightly.
- 5. Roll out remaining pie dough 1/8-inch thick. Pour filling into chilled pie shell and top with remaining dough. Crimp edges and poke a hole in top.
- 6. Bake for 40 minutes, until crust is golden and filling is bubbling hot.

hether you spend a day, a weekend or a week, you're in for a great trip...world-class wines, genuine Texas hospitality and a taste of an exciting agricultural industry that has made Texas the country's fifth-leading, wine producing state. Texas wineries are as diverse as our landscape. You can visit cellars tucked away on country roads or wineries that dominate spacious vistas. You may even see pheasants land in a vineyard or longhorns ramble in a pasture adjacent to rows of Cabernet vines. If time allows, pamper yourself at a charming winery bed and breakfast that will melt away the stress of fast-lane living.

There are eight wine growing regions in Texas and they are as follows; the Bell Mountain
Viticultural Area, the Fredericksburg in the Texas
Hill Country Viticultural Area, the Texas Hill Country
Viticultural Area which is the second-largest
Viticultural Area in the United States, the Escondido
Valley Viticultural Area, The Texas High Plains
Viticultural Area, the Davis Mountain Viticultural Area,
the Mesilla Valley Viticultural Area, and the Texoma
Viticultural Area. Each region offers unique wineries to visit.

Wine Trivia!

- A case of wine holds 12 bottles.
- The overwhelming majority of Texas wine is consumed by Texans.
- The use of cork as a seal for wine bottle dates back to the late 17th century – the corkscrew is a different story. This wonder of the wine age was developed in the mid-1800s.
- Ever wonder how many grapes you have to squeeze to get a single bottle of wine? On average, about 800.
- The oldest winery in Texas, by far, is Val Verde Winery in Del Rio. It first began operation in 1883.
- If you're planting a vineyard, use this formula: one acre
 of grapevines equals about 800 gallons of wine.
- In France, they like their wine and their statues.
 In fact, there are several statues in France honoring
 Thomas Munson, the brilliant Texas viticulturist who developed a phylloxera-resistant rootstock some say single-handedly saving the European wine industry.
- If you like the taste but are watching your waist, a glass of wine (about 4 oz.) contains about 85 calories.
- You don't want to break a wine barrel. It's quite a spill – each barrel holds 60 gallons of wine.
- The roots of the Texas wine industry date back more than three centuries.

How to TICKLE A CATTING



The Krewes of Southeast Texas

here are 25 krewes that make-up the Southeast Texas Mardi Gras, but what is a krewe? A krewe (pronounced in the same way as "crew") is an organization that puts on a parade and/or a ball for the Carnival season of Mardi Gras.

Southeast Texas Mardi Gras was founded in 1992 and its first krewe was the Majestic Krewe of Aurora named after the Goddess of Dawn and the first Port Arthur Settlement. The next year, the Royal Krewe of Neptune joined: it's krewe is named after the Roman God of Waters.

In 1994, the Krewe of Service was created and the Southeast Texas Mardi Gras flourished, becoming the local favorite Mardi Gras carnival for the entire family to enjoy. The Krewe Mon Ami or "my friend" in French also was established in 1994.

The Royal and Majestic Krewe of Artemis is a krewe from Beaumont and are well known for its elaborate parade floats. They were established in 1998.
